

Sand Sculpture Contest

Saturday, May 3rd from 9:00 am until 11:00 am

1. Registration is required. You can register as an individual, civic group, business, family, friends, or any combination! If you are having difficulty registering online via RecDesk, please call the front desk of the Recreation Center to register over the phone or in-person.
2. You may bring fun accessories or props for your creation along with bringing sand shovels and buckets. You must take everything with you upon completion of our event. We cannot leave anything on the beach.
3. The Sand Sculpture is to be made from sand and water only. No additives of any kind (*sugar, flour, glue, paint*) may be used.
4. On event day, you will check-in at the Island Women tent. You can review event details, and you will receive your “Team Number” sticker with QR Code to reference if you need a rule refresher during the event. That way, you will not be required to approach the check-in table from your sand sculpture site position on the beach.
5. After checking in with the Island Women, you will select your own area and workspace. Please be cognizant of other work areas, spectators, and the emergency lane.
6. In your teams, brainstorm, discuss, and select a design to carve. Consider the following criteria listed on the second page that will be used in judging. You will have approximately 1.5 hours to complete your Sand Sculpture.

Judging Criteria

Carving and Design - Sculpture is clean and well defined with consistency and detail in the carving; piece seems balanced and finished.

Use of Plot - Placement of element(s) in plot; usage of the whole plot; finished look of the plot.

Structural Risk - Degree of risk in the sculpture that may come from extreme height and angles, under cuts, and/or cut-throughs.

Creativity - Sculpture is unique, imaginative, and an original idea.

Theme/Story - Sculpture depicts a clear or clever image that fits the designated theme.

Overall Appeal - Sculpture's general appeal and attraction.
